- Once linked, the Google Drive option will appear for opening and saving files. This may take 30-60 seconds for the link to fully complete. Future AppStream sessions will not need

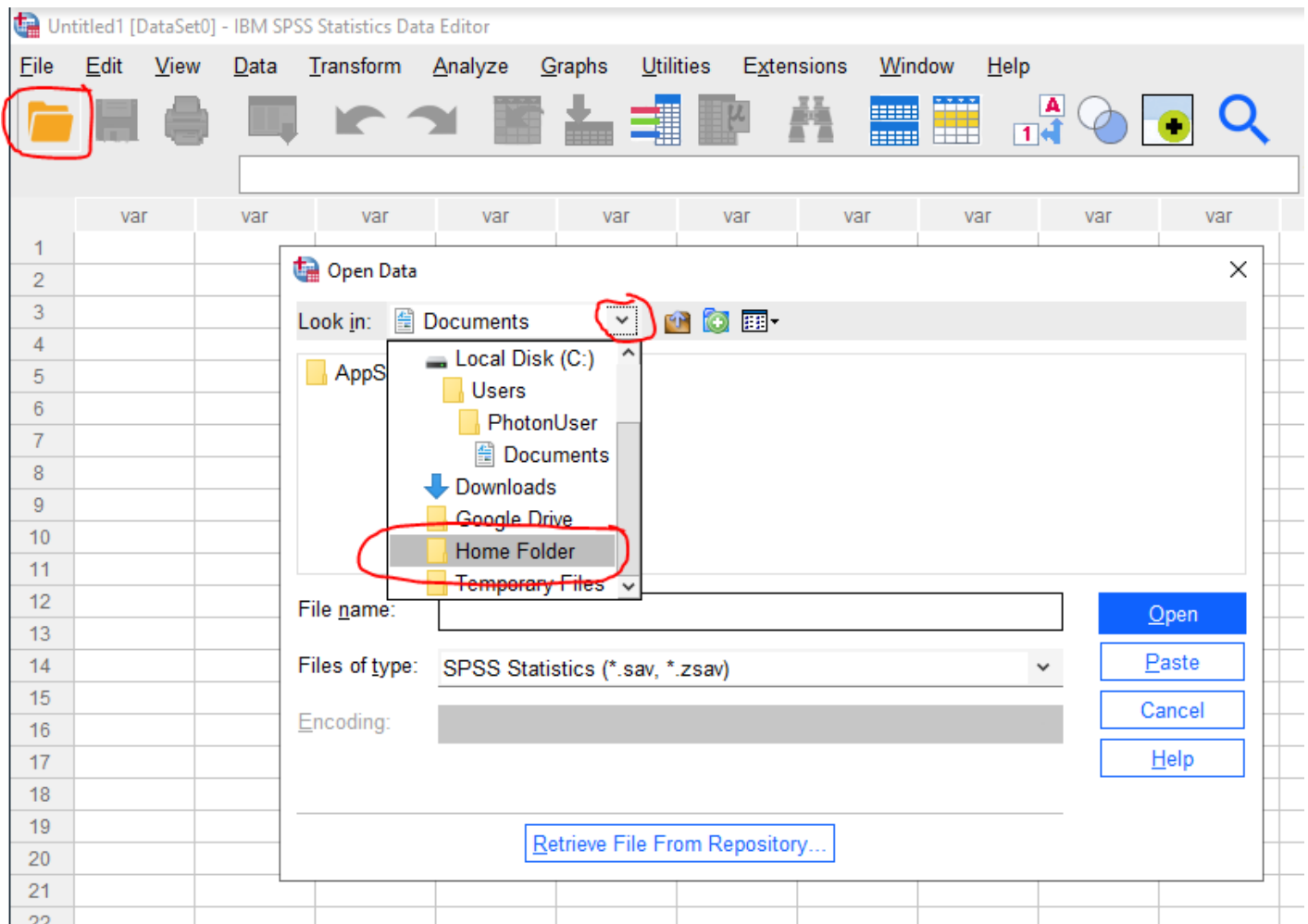

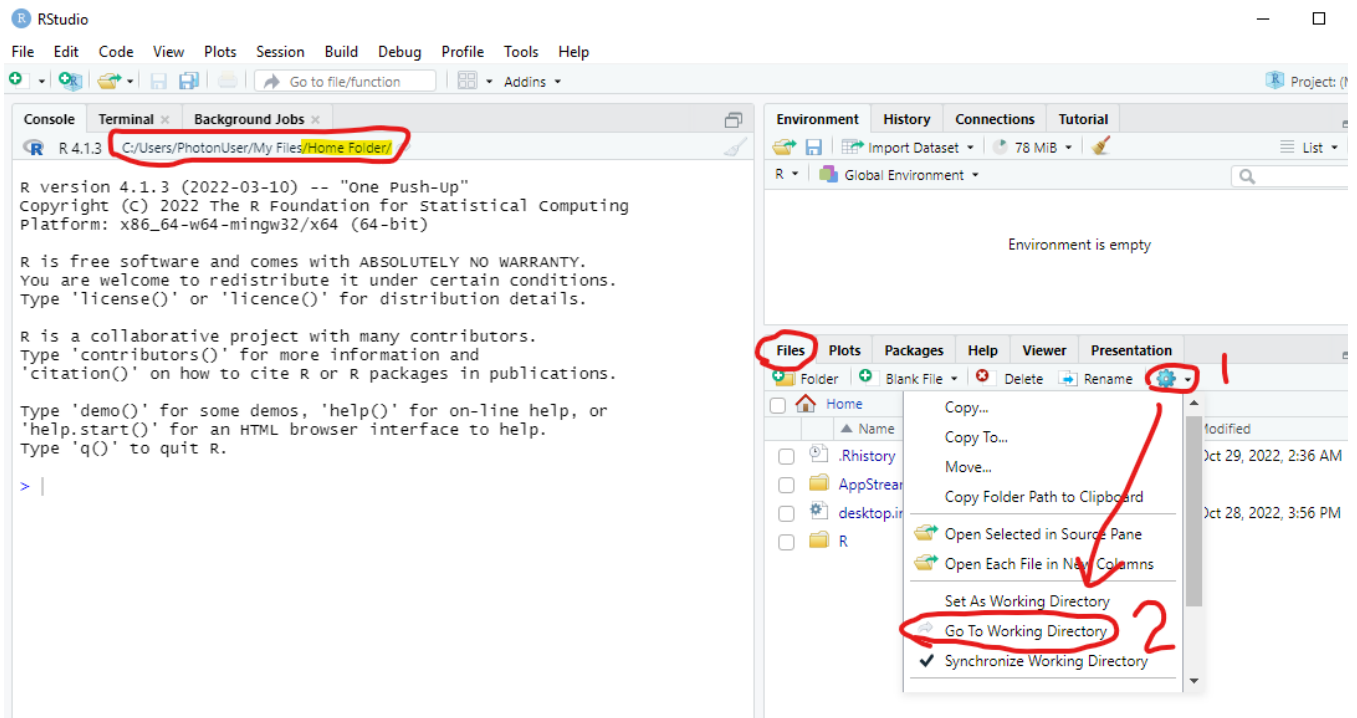


4. Once RStudio has loaded, you should see this:



Using the Home Folder

- The Home Folder is the storage that persists across your AppStream sessions. Any work or files saved there will persist across all AppStream sessions.
- By default, the "Working Folder" of this RStudio AppStream will start in the Home Folder. To avoid confusion, it's usually a good idea to make the "Files" pane also show the Home Folder.



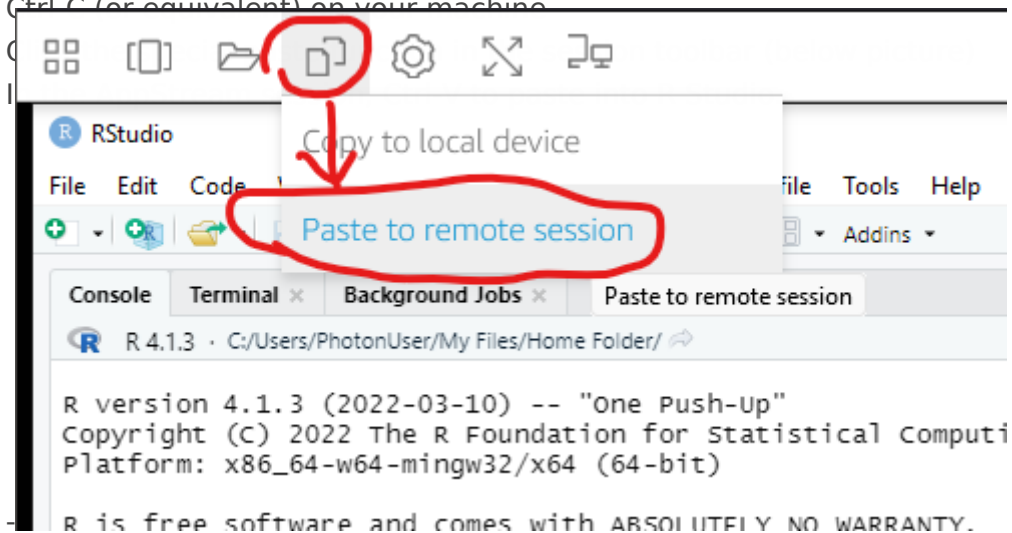
Copy and Paste

3. On your machine, Ctrl-V (or equivalent)

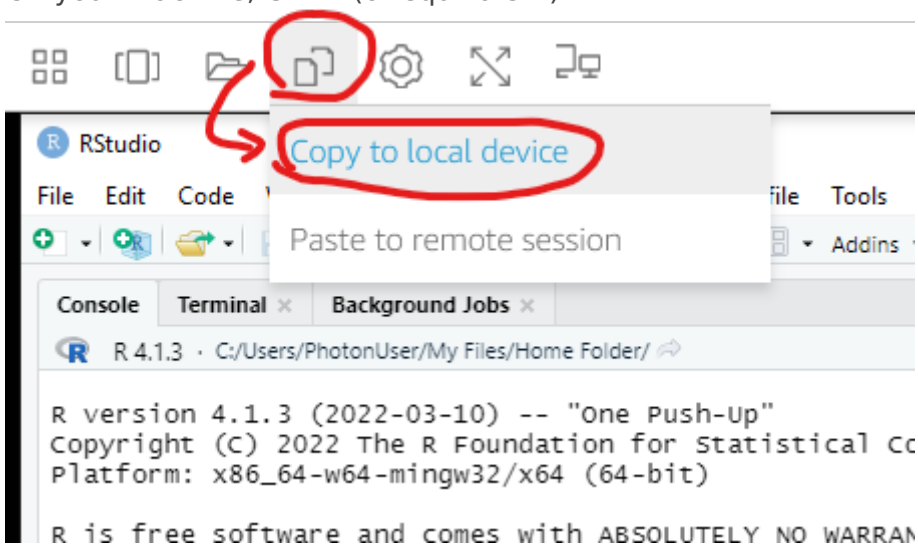


From the AppStream session to your computer:

1. Ctrl-C in the R Studio AppStream session

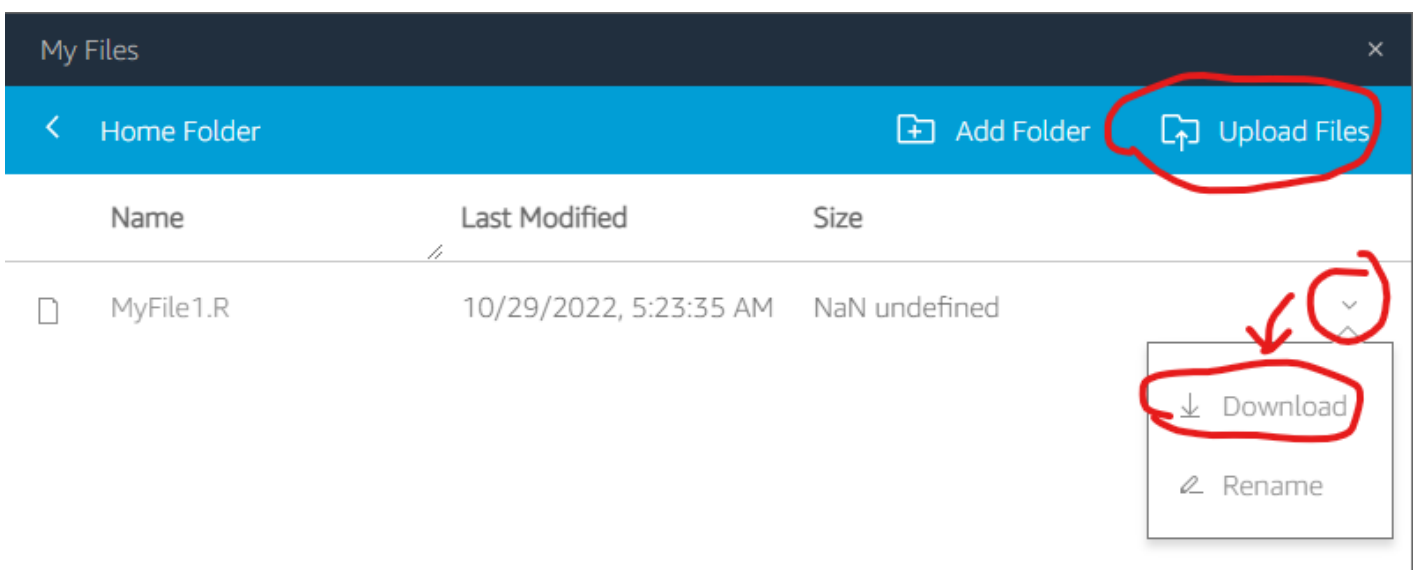
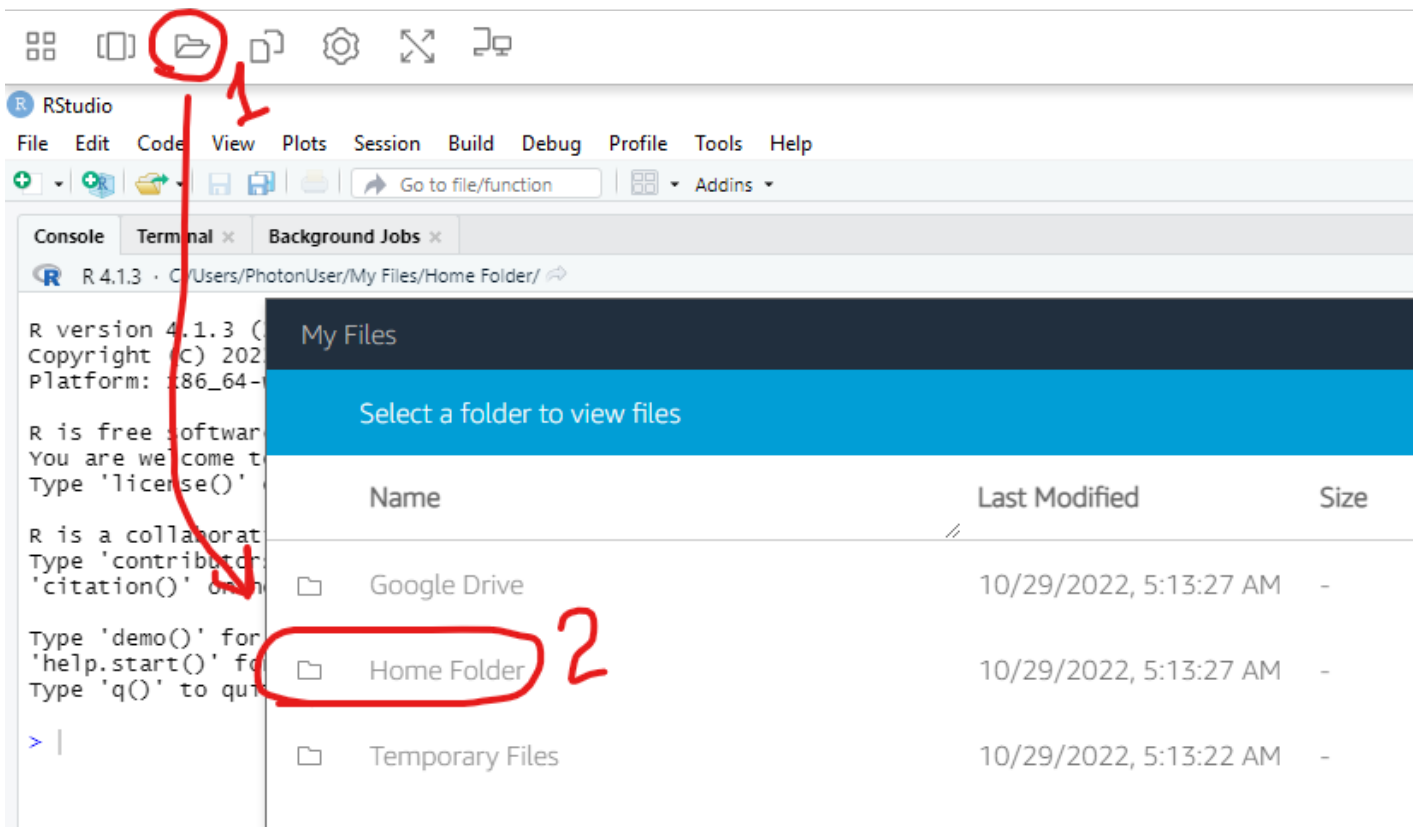
